All must have a known interest in Local Landmarks and District Preservation.

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE – each District has this Committee consisting of 6 members – The Director of IPL or designee, 2 Commission members appointed by Commission, 3 appointed by Commission with Council approval. No fewer than 2 members of each Committee shall be owner-residents or tenants within the District, 1 must be a real estate professional and 1 the owner of income producing property within the District. Members serve at pleasure of Commission. Quorum is 4 members. ECONOMIC REVIEW PANEL – established upon request for an economic hardship exemption. Composed of 3 persons with expertise in real estate and development who are knowledgeable in real estate economics in general. 1 selected by Commission, 1 person selected by applicant and 1 person from economic review panel pool. Economic review panel consists of no less than 3 or more than 12 peoples appointed by Mayor and approved by Council
