3 members shall constitute a quorum in all matters before the Board.

How Appointed

Two appointed by the Mayor with the approval of the Council. Two members appointed by the Jefferson County Sheriff. One member elected by the deputy sheriffs of Jefferson County.

Qualification of Members

At least 30 years old and a resident of the county. No person shall serve on the Board who is a deputy sheriff or who holds any elected public office. No person shall be appointed to the Board who is a member of the immediate family of the Jefferson County Sheriff (father, mother, brother, sister, spouse, son, daughter, aunt, uncle, son-in-law, or daughter-in-law. No person shall serve on the board who is a deputy sheriff or who holds any elected public office.

Purpose

Holding hearings, public and executive, in disciplinary matters concerning deputy sheriffs consistent with the duties and limitations set forth in this Ordinance and KRS 70.260-273

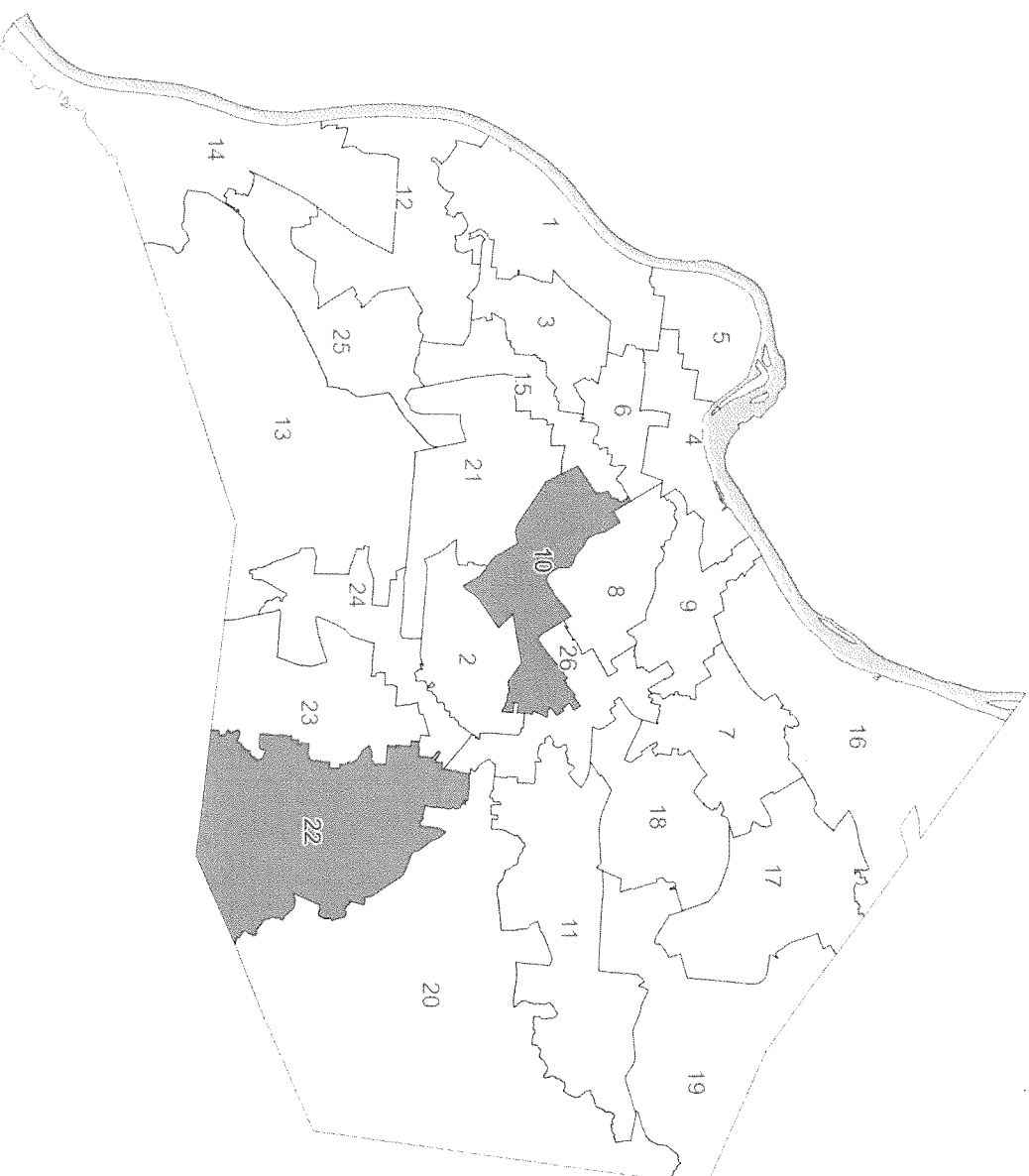
